Home page: On the **Home page**, you can click on buttons to *Message Us, Subscribe to our Newsletter, Volunteer*, and *Join our Facebook Group*. The button, *Checkout New Website Posts*, summarizes the latest website updates. The button, *Set the Record Straight: New Truth Posts* takes you to our latest poster collection, which is intended to compare truths and facts with falsehoods and fictions in a hopefully entertaining and informative manner.

The last five buttons are new additions:

The *Character Matters: Biden-Harris 2024 Ad* video contrasts Biden's presidential actions with Trump's multiple criminal indictments.

The *Biden & Trump Presidential Accomplishment Index*, from The Washington Monthly, provides a comprehensive list of what Donald Trump and Joe Biden have achieved in office.

Firearm Violence: Public Health Crisis in America links to U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy's landmark Advisory, declaring firearm violence in America to be a public health crisis. The advisory outlines the devastating consequences that firearm violence poses, and describes strategies for firearm injury and violence prevention, with a focus on the health and well-being of children, families, and communities.

Biden's New Actions to Keep Families Together announces that the Department of Homeland Security will act to ensure that U.S. citizens with noncitizen spouses and children can keep their families together.

In the new video ad, *Adam Kinzinger Endorsement of Biden*, Kinzinger states that he has "always put America's Democracy and our Constitution above all else," and for that reason is endorsing Biden over Trump.

In another video link, **30 false claims at the Thursday debate**, CNN's Daniel Dale fact checks the false claims made by former President Donald Trump and President Joe Biden during the CNN Presidential Debate.

What's New section:

New on the **What's New** section of the **Home page** is a thorough **Debate Analysis**, with commentary by MSNBC's Lawrence O'Donnell, Simon Rosenberg in his *Hopium Chronicles*, and Rosenberg and Marc Lotter on *Amanpour and Company*. Barack Obama offers an afterthought.

Another part of **What's New**, **Speeches at the Texas Democratic Convention**, links to video talks by Beto O'Rourke and Eddie Morales.

These speeches are followed by a new anti-Trump video ad from **Liz Cheney**, and new videos from **The Lincoln Project** on the Trump threat and Project 2025.

The **Spotlight section** of the page draws attention to news, views, or new book releases that merit more consideration from democrats of all stripes. In the spotlight this month is a remarkable new work by Barbara McQuade, <u>Attack from Within</u>, a New York Times bestseller. Legal scholar and analyst McQuade shows us how to identify the ways disinformation is seeping into all facets of our society and how we can fight against it.

A closely related new effort is <u>The Unraveling: Reflections on Politics without Ethics and</u> <u>Democracy in Crisis</u>, by Bob Bauer, with a foreword by Jon Meacham. Available from the New-York Historical Society, this book has been described as "part memoir, part rumination on the declining moral compass of the American political class," and "the first book to place restoring political ethics at the center of the renewal of American democracy."

The last new book in the spotlight, adapted from the Peabody Award–winning podcast Southlake, is Mike Hixenbaugh's <u>They Came for the Schools: One Town's Fight Over Race and</u> <u>Identity, and the New War for America's Classrooms</u>. Hixenbaugh recaps how the recent conservative war on the teaching of material concerning race, sexuality, and gender kicked off in Southlake, Texas. Acrimony surrounding the school district's proposed diversity plan faced opposition from conservative parents, who eventually funded a takeover of the school board. The new board scrapped the diversity plan, relaxed the anti-bullying disciplinary code, banned books, and sanctioned teachers. Southlake became a national model for the right.

The **Texas section** of this page focuses on events in and affecting our state and covers a wide variety of issues. Recent posts discuss school curriculum overhaul, vouchers, book bans, election disinformation, the Texas Republican Party Platform, Christian nationalism, out-of-state political donors, and Operation Lone Star.

A public school curriculum overhaul proposed by the Texas Education Agency would add teachings on the Bible to state reading and language arts lessons. This overhaul is discussed in an article in The Texas Tribune: **Texas education leaders unveil Bible-infused elementary school curriculum**.

Jeremy Schwartz, with ProPublica, focuses on Greg Abbott's crusade to bring vouchers to Texas: Texas Is the Largest GOP Stronghold Without Pro-School Voucher Legislation. Gov. Abbott Is on a Crusade to Change That.

In *The Texas Observer*, Lise Olsen draws attention to the valiant efforts of a Llano County librarian to resist book ban orders and censorship: **A Small-Town Texas Librarian's Big Stand Against Book Bans**. She was fired, but library patrons filed a lawsuit supported by the Author's Guild.

The *Global Disinformation Lab at the University of Texas at Austin* has constructed a unique resource library to help us learn, understand, and detect disinformation: **Election**

Disinformation Resource Library. The information is organized into easy-to-follow learning tracks, and augmented with fun, interactive quizzes. We all would be advised to investigate this resource.

Bridget Grumet, in the Austin American-Statesman, spotlights new elements in the Texas Republican Party's platform and rules that would seriously challenge our state's voting rights and democratic processes: **Cherish your vote and our democracy**. Republicans regularly attack Democratic donor George Soros as interfering in the politics of the Lone Star State. However, Alexandra Samuels, in *Texas Monthly*, points out that the two biggest political donors in Texas favor Republicans and hail from Nevada and Pennsylvania: **Meet the Out-of-State Political Donors Messing With Texas**.

The *True Texas Project*, an influential grassroots group with close ties to Texas Republican lawmakers, is hosting a conference next month that encourages its attendees to embrace Christian nationalism and resist a Democratic campaign "to rid the earth of the white race." Speakers include Paul Gottfried, a far-right writer who has for years collaborated with white supremacists. Robert Downen and Juan Salinas provide details in *The Texas Tribune*: **"War on white America": Influential Texas group hosting pro-Christian nationalism conference**.

Republicans regularly attack Democratic donor George Soros as interfering in the politics of the Lone Star State. However, Alexandra Samuels, in *Texas Monthly*, points out that the two biggest political donors in Texas favor Republicans and hail from Nevada and Pennsylvania: **Meet the Out-of-State Political Donors Messing With Texas**.

The American Civil Liberties Union of Texas has produced a new report on Gov. Greg Abbott's Operation Lone Star (OLS): **Operation Lone Star: Misinformation and Discrimination In Texas Border Enforcement**. The conclusion: OLS spends billions of dollars to racially profile and arrest people who pose no threat to public safety, then forces them into a separate and unequal legal system run by the state.

The **National section** of the **News & Views page** contains many thoughtful articles on a wide range of subjects – firearm violence, keeping immigrant families together, a comparison of Biden and Trump presidential accomplishments, separation of church and state, public schools, corporate political donations, Trumponomics, abortion bans, Supreme Court accountability, Trump, Ken Burns address at Brandeis University, Project 2025, and much more.

Action Returns Fight Book Bans! Become a Grassroots Co-Sponsor of the Resolution to Defend the Right to Read

The core of democratic discourse is under a brutal assault as an escalating wave of book bans sweeps across the United States. The numbers are alarming: There have been 6,000 book bans since July 2021, with a 33% increase in bans since just last year.

This includes classic and award-winning books that have been a part of school curriculum for decades. Titles like Brave New World, The Handmaid's Tale, Anne Frank's Diary: The Graphic

Adaptation, The Color Purple, and To Kill a Mockingbird are being yanked from libraries and banned from schools.

Now, Congress is finally taking action. Senator Brian Schatz and Representative Jamie Raskin have introduced a resolution to stop book bans and defend the right to read.

Defending freedom is popular. NPR reports, the majority of Americans, including the majority of Republicans, are against lawmakers banning books.
